ROTARY CLUBS PROVIDE EMERGENCY SHELTER, AID TO THOUSANDS IN MYANMAR

As the humanitarian crisis worsened in Myanmar's delta region after a powerful Cyclone hit on 3 May, a response team of four specially trained volunteers moved into devastated areas six days later to distribute more than 800 ShelterBox containers.



ShelterBox, a grass-roots disaster relief organization supported by Rotary clubs around the world, was among the first charities to reach cyclone victims.

Desperately needed aid from many other groups had been stalled at the border by Myanmar's military government.

More than one million people have been left homeless by the disaster, and 100,000 are feared dead, the United Nations reports. The team will work in cooperation with local groups in Myanmar to line up transportation and determine where the shelters will do the most good amid the massive devastation.

The first deployment of Shelter/Boxes will benefit more the 10,000 survivors. Each container provides a tent, stove, water purification kit, blankets, tools, and other necessities to help a family of 10 survive for six months. Some include two 10-person tents, doubling the usual shelter capacity.

ShelterBox was launched in 2000 as a project of the Helston-Lizard, England Rotary club and quickly garnered support among Rotary clubs worldwide. To date, the nonprofit has raised \$29 million and delivered aid to over 40 countries in response to more than 70 disasters. Each complete ShelterBox costs \$1000 to sponsor, and Rotary clubs provide about half the charity's funding.

GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE TEAMS

What Is It?

This is a unique cultural and vocational exchange opportunity for young business and professional men and women between the ages of 25 and 40 in the initial years of their professional life. The program provides travel grants for teams of young participants to exchange visits between paired areas in different countries.

For four to six weeks, team members accompanied by a Rotarian team leader study the host country's institutions and ways of life, observe their own vocations as practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas.

Our district is seeking both a team leader and team members for a group study exchange to India.

Dates

This India team will be gone from December 27, 2008, through January 25, 2009.

Application Dead Lines

Applications must in our office by June 19, 2008.

Requirements

Team leader candidates must be knowledgeable Rotarians, especially in

International Service

Team members should be employed in any recognized business or profession and must have been actively engaged in that area for at least two years at the time of application. Rotary International requires that team member candidates be between the ages of 25-40.

Time Commitment and Expense

Both the team leader and team members must make themselves available for a series of orientation meetings between their selection date and the date of departure. Trip expenses will be minimal since RI provides transportation costs and Rotarians in the hosting district provide meals and lodging.

This conference began in 1947 and was originally called the Saint Paul Young Men's Conference. High School senior boys from

all over the state came to Saint Paul for a weekend stay in Rotarian homes, to visit Saint Paul businesses, and learn about career selections. In 1970 the location was changed to Camp St. Croix in Hudson and high school sophomore and junior boys and girls were now welcome to attend. The name was changed to Saint Paul Rotary Youth Leadership Conference emphasizing the leadership and career counseling given. In 2000 the name was change to Camp RYLA. This leadership conference promotes and teaches leadership skills to America's finest youth. Rotary provides on-site counselors and presenters who are leaders from the community. Rochester Rotary Clubs have sent a student from each of our high schools since the first conference 61 years ago.

Rotarian Jay Toogood drove the students to Camp RYLA, at Camp St. Croix near Hudson, WI. Students were Joanna Zhang, Mayo HS; Bevy Lehman, Mayo HS; Gretchen Sitzer, Lourdes HS.
